the best use of information. A person with critical thinking skills is able to sift through information to determine accuracy and relevancy in order to solve problems and to make decisions that are ethical. A person who is able to use critical thinking is a good citizen in a society.

The second principle for the rational of this course is that learning critical thinking is hard but teaching it is harder. Critical thinking is not about the accumulation of information but about the process of reasoning, which is different from the process of rationalising. Critical thinking is not about being argumentative or simply questioning purposelessly, it is about

understanding the difference between reasoning and rationalising and being able to use the correct process to analyse information. It is about actively and skilfully analysing, synthesising and evaluating information and knowing how to put it together to derive at a conclusion that is the best and most ethical taken the circumstances into consideration.
